

Mayor's Fares On-Line Panel Survey October 2023 Results



Background

The Combined Authority commissioned an on-line panel survey to gain some insight into West Yorkshire Residents' use and perceptions of the £2 single and £4.50 fare caps (Mayor's Fares) that were introduced on 04 September 2022.

The survey was conducted from 12 to 24 October 2023 to represent one year on from the launch and 1,028 responses were received from residents aged 19 to 65.


The age range 19 to 65 was chosen to encompass the target audience for turn-up-and-go Adult fares.

Awareness: 62% said they were aware of Mayor's Fares, and a further 16% might have heard something about them


Awareness: Are you aware of Mayor's Fares (a £2 fare cap for single journeys and £4.50 for the day)?

Bus use: 25% of respondents are using buses more than before Mayor's Fares, with an overall net gain in bus use


The difference between the share of respondents reporting increased use vs decreased bus use is small but statistically significant*.


Mayors Fares & Bus Use: Of those who said they were using bus more often, two-thirds said this was due to Mayor's Fares

Mayors Fares & Bus Use: 38% those who use the bus the same amount as before Mayors Fares said that it has encouraged them to keep using buses




- Four pre-coded options were designed to elicit motivation for reduced bus use. Service issues account for 32% of respondents using buses less. Changes to work, study, personal circumstances, or health make up 54% of respondents.
- The remaining 14% use the bus less for other reasons, including nearly 10% who show an outcome of increase in car use, but not the motivation behind it.



Bus use: less often


Mayors Fares & Bus Use: 35% of respondents are either using buses more or are encouraged to keep using buses due to Mayor's Fares

Further Detail and Comparisons

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Method and Caveats

In this section Mayor's Fares may be shortened to MF.

Where the phrases 'occasional bus user', 'regular bus user' or 'non-bus user' are mentioned these follow the definitions described in West Yorkshire Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP) Regular - at least once a week Occasional - less than once a week but at least every 3 months Non-User - either never uses or uses very rarely.


Throughout this report, the use of the term significantly, or significant refers to statistical significance at the 95% level using the Wilson Score method ^{1,2}.

Respondents Reached: The Mayor's Fares survey includes a significantly higher percentage of regular bus users than the annual perceptions of transport survey.

The Mayor's Fares survey includes a significantly higher percentage of regular bus users than the annual perceptions of transport survey (47% of respondents were regular bus users compared with 29% in the latest annual West Yorkshire Residents Perceptions of Transport survey, or 35% pre-COVID for a similar age cohort). The Mayor's Fares survey also includes significantly fewer occasional bus users and non-bus users.


The Mayor's Fares on-line panel survey relied entirely from members of the public who had previously signed up to an independent panel and the research company Toluna invited panel members to take part. The West Yorkshire Residents Perceptions of Transport survey previously was 100% telephone based, and in the latest wave used a mixed method of telephone and on-line panel with the survey company using telephone interviews to reach demographic groups who were under-represented by the on-line responses and vice-versa.

78% of regular bus users aware of Mayor's Fares.

78% of regular bus users are aware of Mayor's Fares. This is a significantly higher level of awareness than the **63%** of occasional bus users who are aware, which is in turn significantly higher awareness than non-bus users of whom only **36%** aware.




Awareness of Mayor's Fares

Regular users are significantly more likely to have increased their bus use than occasional users.

Compared to before September 2022, **39%** of regular bus users have increased their bus use as against **23%** of occasional users. It appears respondents who use the bus 4 days a week are the most likely to have increased their use, with **55%** of respondents saying so, though the difference is only significant when compared to respondents who use the bus 1 day per week or less.



Bus Use Compared With Before Mayor's Fares

Passenger generation and retention: Bus use attributable to Mayor's Fares appears most likely in respondents using buses 1 to 3 days per week.

Of respondents using the bus more than before, those using bus 1 to 3 days per week were significantly more likely to do so than those using the bus 4 to 7 days per week. Of respondents using the bus the same amount as before, regular bus users were significantly more likely to say that this usage has been encouraged by Mayor's Fares than occasional bus users (56% to 38%).




Awareness and Bus Use: Differences by Gender, Age, and Ethnicity

- Females are more likely to be unaware of Mayor's Fares than males (28% v 16%).
- Respondents with white ethnic backgrounds are more likely to be unaware ٠ of Mayor's Fares than Asian / Asian British backgrounds (26% v 15%).
- There was no significant difference between the age bands. ٠

Awareness

- Females more likely to have reduced their bus use (24%) than males (15%).
- Age 19-30 more likely to have increased their bus use (32%) than age 31-50 (23%) or age 51-65 (21%).
- People of Black, Black British, Caribbean or African backgrounds are more likely to have increased their use (43%) than white (24%).

Bus Use Compared with before September 2022





Respondents who Use Bus More: Differences by Gender, Age, and Ethnicity

- Although there appear to be gender, age and ethnicity differences in whether increased use is due to Mayor's Fares these have not been found to be statistically significant.
- Age 19-30 are less likely to have replaced car driver journeys with bus journeys (15%) than age 31-50 or age 51-65 (both 47%).
- Age 19-30 are more likely to have replaced car passenger journeys with bus use (22%) than age 31-50 (9%) or age 51-65 (5%).
- Other apparent changes are not statistically significant.

Reasons for Same or Less Use: Differences by Gender, Age, and Ethnicity

- Among respondents who use the bus the same amount as they used to, those age 51-65 are more likely to say that price isn't the main reason behind their choice (60%) than age 19-31 (41%).
- Other apparent differences in reasons to use less are not statistically ٠ significant.



- Although 33% of males and only 15% of females gave reliability / punctuality issues as the reason for using bus less it is not statistically significant.
- Other apparent differences in reasons to use less are not statistically significant.



Mayors Fares Impact: Differences in sentiment by Age and Gender

Male respondents are significantly more likely than females to agree that Mayor' Fares have made the cost of bus travel easier to understand (73% cf. 64%)

Respondents aged 51-65 are significantly more likely than aged 19-30 to agree that Mayor' Fares have made the cost of bus travel easier to understand (76% cf. 62%)



Mayors Fares Impact: Differences in sentiment by Ethnic Background

- Respondents of Black, Black British, Caribbean or African ethnic backgrounds more likely to agree each of the following about Mayor's
 Fares than respondents of White ethnic backgrounds.
 - Mayor's Fares have personally saved me money (68% cf. 48%),
 - Mayor's Fares have helped me manage the cost-of-living crisis (60% cf. 42%),
 - Mayor's Fares have made it easier for me to make multiple bus journeys on the same day (77% cf. 57%);
- Respondents of Black, Black British, Caribbean or African ethnic backgrounds were more likely to than White ethnic backgrounds to say that they would recommend using the bus to others as a result of the fare cap (81% cf. 62%).

• The survey target was residents aged 19 to 65. For age, gender, and district the latest population has been obtained from ONS Mid-year population estimates 2021, selecting only the relevant ages.

- Population by ethnicity by single year of age was not available in published tables so is for all ages.
- Due to data protection concerns with the survey supplier using systems not covered by UK / EU data protection the survey did not capture characteristics relating to health or disability outcomes, nor to specific location or deprivation.
- The survey method excluded digitally excluded residents.
